I attended and spoke the pain and agony of our elders due to partition of the country. I am grateful to the Postal Authorities for inviting me and honouring my father and remembering his achievements. The media covered the event. It is pertinent to mention here that Ch. G. L. Datta 'Josh' was the first time recipient of "Meghdoot Dak Sewa Award", the highest award of Postal Department introduced in 1988.

Dr Mehta Vasishtha Dev Mohan

(28 Sep 1917– 12 Sep 2003)

Dr Mehta Vasishtha Dev Mohan was an Indian scholar of Pali and Sanskrit languages. He was a dedicated scholar



and an academician. He was born on 28 Sep 1917 in village Jafarwal District Shekhupura and grew up in a middle-class Hindu family. His initial schooling was, with Sanskrit medium from Gurukul Kangri, Haridwar (1925 to 1933)

Dr M.V.D Mohan was a bright student and had an exceptionally good, academic record. He

pursued his education, through out, on scholarship only. During 1939, He qualified intermediate examination from S D College, Panjab University Lahore. He was awarded Silver Medal and Merit Scholarship. Understand that there was a government policy, of awarding Gold medal to the toppers of English and Science subjects only, else he was the topper of the university and deserved gold medal. During 1941, he appeared for Bachelor of Arts examination from the same college and was awarded Gold Medal and Merit scholarship. He was ranked First in the examination in Panjab University. He was awarded Gold Medal as he stood first in MA Examination conducted by Panjab University Lahore during 1943. Immediately after his postgraduation, he joined Royal Air Force as a pilot officer and served as a pilot for a short period during second world war. He was also a follower of Arya Samaj movement and had actively participated in several Arya Samaj social welfare activities, during pre-partitioned period.

During 1946-47, He joined Government College Ludhiana, as a Professor of Sanskrit and Hindi subjects and taught the students of Degree, Honors and Post Graduation classes. Consequent to his retirement after a brief tenure of two years as Principal at Government College Narnaul, he continued his teaching in Sanskrit & research work at Vishveshvanand Research Institute (VVRI) at Hoshiarpur as a Senior most teacher in the Post Graduate Section of V.V.R.I, Panjab University (1972 to 1987).

The contributions of Dr M.V.D. Mohan, in the field of the "History of Ancient India" are known worldwide. He was also a fellow member of ICHR and had massive contributions in the field of historical research work. His important contributions are being produced on you tube channel: <https://youtube.com/c/Mohanalok>

The Published work of Dr Mehta Vasishtha Dev Mohan, on Sanskrit and Indology is very commendable and will be of great help to our youth keen on historical research, which is a very vast and interesting subject.

His Research work was highly appreciated by historians of world fame—Dr A L Bhasham of London University opined as follows: "This thesis is in my opinion, is one of the finest from an Indian University that I have yet seen in what is now quit a lengthy period of acting as an external examiner. It is detailed, thorough and original and the author's command of English is well above average standards of Indian University teachers at present time" – Dr F.R. Allchin of Cambridge University opined as follows: "This candidate has attained a very high level, both in collection and critically assessing historical materials. The candidates presentation of his work and Command of the English language are also highly satisfactory"

Those were the days when students of Sanskrit & ancient history used to find it difficult to understand the subject in the Brahmi and Kharoshthi scripts ie .the script of ancient Indian Inscriptions. Dr Mehta Vasishtha Dev Mohan was the first scholar to convert this script to Devnagri and Roman & there after translated the research work to Sanskrit Hindi & English. This work facilitated students to understand the subject easily. Several research scholars, of ancient indian history, have cited his research work, which is available on many important websites like Google Scholar, Archive.org etc.

Dr Mehta Vasishtha Dev Mohan was the founder president of "Bhartiya Vidya Mandir" Society & Trust, at Ludhiana. During the last phase of his academic career, he headed large Government College as 'Principal'. During early 1984, the Chairman of DAV Managing Committee, Professor Ved Vyas, appointed him as a Professor & Joint Director in Dr Sternbuck Foundation in Delhi.

On 30 Nov 1984, he met with a major accident and was bed ridden for a very long time, due Cervical fracture. Dr Mehta Vasishtha was a highly dedicated academician and research scholar. During last phase of his life also, he continued his research work, while he was bed ridden for a long period due cancer.

The main purpose of his visits to various archeological sites was to fill various crevices and gaps of ancient Indian history. His work has helped building true history of India. Recently Vice Chancellor of Nalanda university, had also appreciated his historical work and included in the history text books, for the benefit of university students. Dr Mehta Vasishtha Dev Mohan was a legendary personality and it is very difficult to describe his accomplishments in a few words. He lived a disciplined and upright life and had set a great example to all of us.

Pandit Rambhaji Dutt Choudhary **Freedom fighter, noted Gandhian & Social reformer** **(26 Feb 1866 – 6 Aug 1923)**

"I had a Punjabi friend, Rambhaji Dutt Choudhary, who is now no more. Sometimes he composed poems. When he came out of jail he brought along a poem he had composed, and since he himself could not sing he asked his wife Sarala to sing it. In her melodious voice Sarala sang: "Never admit defeat even if you should lose life." And I told myself that I would never accept defeat"—Gandhi Ji Speech at prayer meeting in Delhi on June 13, 1947.



Pandit Rambhaji Dutt Choudhary was the son of Ch. Radha Krishan Dutt. He was born on 26 Feb 1866 in Kanjur. After completing his graduation from the F.C. College Lahore, he did his Law degree and started practice in the High Court of Lahore. He was the founder member of Indian National Congress and had the privilege to attend all the sessions of Indian National Congress till his death. In 1905 he got married to Sarala Devi Choudharani, the niece of nationalist poet, Rabindranath Tagore. She was the first woman political leader of her time and she was the leader of the anti-British Govt. Her father Janakinath Ghoshal was one of the earliest secretaries of Indian National Congress.

Pandit Rambhaji Dutt Choudhary and his wife Sarala Devi Choudharani became followers of Mahatma Gandhi in 1919 and sent their son Dipak to Gandhi's Ashram for education. Gandhi admired them for their patriotism and the spirit of self-sacrifice. He told the people of Gujrat that the message of Rambhaji Dutt which, according to him, was also the message of entire Punjab was fearlessness: "It asks you never to accept defeat, come what may, to love God and work on with patience and fortitude." His dedication to Swadeshi Movement was evident from his decision to exclude all foreign clothes during his son's marriage. This further impressed Gandhiji. He also led relief work at the time of Kangra earthquake. Pandit ji was close to revolutionaries like Sardar Ajit Singh (uncle of Bhagat Singh), Lala Lajpat Rai, Lala Harkishan Lal and Master Amir Chand. He was also very close to leaders like Balgangadhar Tilak, Pt. Madan Mohan Malaviya, Swami Sharadhdhanand, Abdul Kalam Azad, Dr. Kitchlew, Dr. Satyapal, Shaikat Ali, and Surendranath Bannerji.

Pandit Rambhaji Dutt Choudhary was a very respectable person in the Congress and Gandhiji had a special regard for him as he was highly impressed with his patriotism. Pandit Ji had played an important role in the various subject committees of Congress at national level. He took active

part in the freedom struggle. After the Jallianwala Bagh massacre, he was arrested by British Govt. under Defence of India Rule and his property was confiscated. He took active part in Khilafat movement initiated by Mahatma Gandhi.

Rambhaji Dutt Choudhary was one of the few leaders of the Punjab who took keen interest in the activities of the Congress during the early period of its development. At its Lahore Session in 1900 he seconded the resolution moved by Surendranath Bannerji condemning the exclusion of Indians from higher Public Services and in this session he was elected a member of the Subjects Committee of Congress party. He also supported Tilak's resolution on famine, poverty and land revenue at its Banaras Session in 1905. At its twenty-third session in 1908, he moved a resolution demanding that posts of higher ranks in the army might be thrown open to Indians. He represented Punjab on a committee appointed at the twenty-fifth session of the Congress at Allahabad in 1910 to prepare an Address to be presented to Lord Hardinge, the Viceroy and Governor-General of India. The resolution thanking the Government of India and the secretary of State for annulling the partition of Bengal passed at the twenty-sixth session in 1911 also received his support. He condemned the policy of racial discrimination of the Government of Canada at the 28th session of the congress in 1913 at Karachi. He opposed the Rowlatt Act. He, therefore, took prominent part in the agitation against this legislation. He composed a song at this time which was "Kadi Nahin Harna, Bhaven Sadi Jan Jave." This song caught the imagination of the people of the province. He presided over the memorable meeting at Bradlaugh Hall in Lahore on April 6, called to protest against Rowlatt Act. His fearless attacks on the Government added to his rising popularity and the British Government arrested him on April 14, 1919, along with Harkishan Lal and Duni Chand under Lahore Conspiracy case as a result of which he was sentenced to transportation for life and his property was confiscated. He was described as the "Chief Spokesman of the Conspiracy". He was released by the Secretary of State, Montague, to create favourable atmosphere for introduction of his reforms scheme.

He also presided over the first political conference at Rohtak on 6-8th November, 1920 to pass the non-cooperation resolution which was also attended by Lala Lajpat Rai, Swami Satya Dev, Choudhary Chhotu Ram, K.A. Desai, Neki Ram Sharma, Choudhary Matu Ram (Grandfather of Bhupinder Singh Hooda, Ex CM Haryana).

Pandit Rambhaji Dutt Choudhary did a lot of social work as well for the depressed classes of Punjab province. He is remembered by these people even today and since 1934 his birthday is celebrated as a mark of respect and

recognition. Shri Jagjivan Ram and many others national leaders graced the function of his birthday celebration in Gurdaspur District. Moreover the people of depressed classes of Gurdaspur district still regard him as their Guru. A memorial (Pandit Rambhaj Dutt Veda Bhawan) was also setup by late Shri B D Birla. The foundation stone of this memorial was laid down by Smt. Kasturba Gandhi, wife of Mahatma Gandhi, at Awankha -Dinanagar, Distt Gurdaspur, Punjab on 16th July 1934.

Like Lajpat Rai and Swami Sharaddhanand, Rambhaj Dutt Choudhary was a prominent member of the Arya Samaj. He was a forceful advocate of National Education and in pursuance of it he sent his eldest son, Jagdish to a gurukul for his education. He was also engaged in the programmes of the Arya Samaj that included the upliftment of the depressed classes. Pandit ji also struggled hard to eliminate discrimination against the backward through education and propoganda. His work in Gurdaspur district in this connection received the approbation of the people. He was the President of All India Shuddhi Sabha and converted about five lakhs people of Punjab and bring back them to the mainstream of Hinduism. He travelled from village to village with Aryas preaching and performing shuddhi process.

Besides these he was well known journalist and launched two newspapers in Urdu & English, 'The Hindustan.' He was the member of the Municipal Corporation, Lahore and took an active part in the civic affairs. He was also a working committee member of Indian National congress. He went to England in September 1908 to explain to the British Government the cause of unrest in the Punjab province and the Government had to implement his scheme to cool down the unrest in the province.

Gandhi Ji had brotherly relation with Rambhaj Dutt Choudhary and it was Sarala Devi and Gandhi Ji proposed to Pandit Jawahar Lal Nehru to get Indira married to Dipak Dutt, the son of Pandit Rambhaj Dutt and Sarala Devi. The proposal, however, could not materialize. Their son, Dipak, later got married to the grand-niece of Mahatma Gandhi, Radha. Radha was the daughter of Maganlal Gandhi.

Both Rambhaj Dutt Choudhary and his wife Sarala Devi were champions of Indian freedom movement. Their selfless contribution to freedom struggle, upliftment of women, weaker section and patriotic literature which had inspired many to jump into the freedom struggle to free the India from British Raj have immortalised their names on the pages of Indian history. Pandit Rambhaj Dutt Choudhary died on 6th August, 1923 in Mussoorie.

Besides, this festival is also celebrated in every city and town, in school, college and university etc.

Our school also celebrates this festival every year. For this year, we had made all the preparations. In this year we celebrated the 75th Independence Day celebration. Shri Girish Mohan ji was the Chief Guest of the Programme. He hoisted the National Flag on the school building at 10:00 am. All the students and teachers saluted the flag and then sang the National Anthem. Then followed the Cultural Programme. Patriotic Poems and Songs were recited both by the teachers and the students. Some students also presented the group dance and skits. In the end, the Principal Smt Shubhangi Bishnoi delivered the short speech. RAVI KE USS PAAR

Geography was a very important subject at that time in our school. We knew about the longitude and latitude of earth and difference of 4 minutes in time for every one degree of longitude difference. It is at that time that I knew the names of rivers Jehlam, Chanab, Ravi, Beas and Sutluj the five rivers from where the name Panj (five) and Aab (water-river) originated. I also learnt the meaning of the word Doaba (two waters) the land between two rivers taking alphabets from the names of the rivers to name the Doaba. Our area in Punjab was Doaba Bari between the rivers Beas and Ravi. Similarly Doaba Bist is between Beas and Satluj, Rachna between in between Ravi and Chenab and Chaj between Jehlum and Chenab.

River Ravi is in the middle of the five rivers. Before partition area wise Mohyals could be divided into two groups. One group staying in the north in areas like Jehlum, Rawalpindi, Abbottabad, Mansera etc. The 2nd group in the east in areas like Lahore, Amritsar and Shakargarh etc. Because of the distances, lack of travel facilities and slight difference in the accent and language the two groups very rarely mixed. Matrimonial alliances generally occurred within the same group. People were hesitant to marry their daughters to boys in the other group. A very popular saying amongst Mohyals at that time was: "Ja Dheeye Ravi - Nan Aveen Nan Jaaven" Dear daughter if you marry across the river Ravi you shall not be able to come and go and lose all contact with your parents.

Before partition there used to be areas of Mohyal concentration in different villages, towns etc. The name of the dominating caste was generally associated with the name of the particular village or town of domination. They were called Mohyal Mandis. Coming to my area of Doaba Bari there was concentration of Dutts in Kanjgur Duttan, Veerum Duttan, Zafarwal Duttan etc. For Mohan's there was Japuwal Mohanan near Gurdaspur, Lambra Mohanan near Jallandhar, Balarwal Mohanan near Batala from where late Padamshri NN Mohan came from. If you explore you will find in the earlier generations of Mohyal Boys and girls from Zafarwal Duttan, Kanjgur/Veerum in fact whole of Shakargarh Tehsil etc. married Mohyal boys and girls from Amritsar, Lambra, Japuwal. In my family from Amritsar my wife, my mother and my grandmother all come from Veerum/Kanjgur.

River Ravi originates from Himalayas in Himachal Pradesh, Touching Jammu and Kashmir it reaches Punjab where it forms about 80 Kms. border between India and Pakistan. Partition was of the whole India but it specifically effected Mohyal lands in Punjab. Before 1920 or so there was no rail link between the left side of river Ravi and its right side. When trains were started first time in Punjab people from east started going to Batala by train, take a Tonga or mule, go to Dera Baba Nanak cross the river Ravi in a boat or floating platform take again a horse and pony and then go to their destination Kanjgur Veerum etc. This was the position when my grandfather a primary student at Amritsar (b. 1875) married my grandmother two years elder to him at Veerum Duttan. My grandmother had told me that It was the rainy season with floods in the river

Ravi. When waiting for the child bridegroom and the party girls of the village used to tease her telling her that the boat carrying her marriage party has disappeared in the flood.

Amritsar was a great business centre in Punjab. Goods used to be received at Amritsar from Kashmir on horse back. Britishers established a train connection between Amritsar and Sialkot. A bridge was constructed on the river Ravi near Dera Baba Nanak. The word Bridge in Arabic is called Jassar. So the village across Dera Baba Nanak on the right Bank of Ravi was also called Jassar. Dera Baba Nanak is 55 kms from Amritsar. I have travelled on this line before partition many times and remember the names of railway stations in between. These are Verka, Majeetha, Fatehgarh Churian, Har do Rwal (village of Mehta Lal Chand Mohan, father of Mehta Des Raj Mohan. The village was on both sides of the line that is why it was called Har Do Rwal). Next was Ramdas and then Dera Baba Nanak. After crossing the Jassar bridge the train reached Jassar station in Pakistan. After a stop there the train used to go to Narowal and beyond to Sialkot for connection with Jammu. Another branch line was started in 1924 from Lahore to Chak Amru on the border of Jammu. The station next to Jassar junction on the Chak Amru line is Darbar Sahib Kartar Pur which was in the news recently at the time of opening of Kartarpur corridor. The Jassar Bridge and the line between Jassar and Chak Amru was destroyed by the Pakistanis themselves during the 1965 war to stop the advancement of Indian Army. They also closed the Amritsar line from Jassar junction to Sialkot.

When in 1924 the Railway line between Shahdara Bagh and Chak Amru was constructed it was passing through Veerum Duttan. The land the railway line and the railway station was given to the Railway Department by Dutts of Veerum Duttan. The Dutts under the leadership of Ch. Gurandutta Mal Musafir grandfather of Professor VN Dutta who was the Manager of British Ambala Club had petitioned that the railway station in the area should be called Veeram Duttan. Since 1920 Akalis in Punjab had been agitating for freeing the Gurdwaras in the country from the control of Udasi Mahants the followers of Baba Siri Chand the elder son of Baba Nanak. The Akalis wanted the station to be called Kartarpur the name of the village given by Guru Nanak Dev Ji. It was not possible to do so because there already existed a Railway Station of that name in the Indian Railways near Jallandhar. Dutts of Veerum were very happy on this development thinking that the new station would now be named after their village. There was lot of political pressure from the Akali Dal and as a way out the station was named Darbar Sahib Kartarpur. Mohyals going to the five Dutt villages coming from Amritsar would get down at Jassar junction and board the connecting train coming from Lahore to reach the very next station Darbar Sahib Kartarpur and proceed to their destination Veerum, Kanjgur etc. on horse back or on foot as the case may be.

Partition of India was a big misfortune. Gandhi was against partition. It was agreed in the partition plan to transfer the provinces with Muslim majority to Pakistan and those with

majority of non-Muslims to India. The two provinces with marginal differences in the percentage of population were Punjab and Bengal. North Western Frontier Province which was under the rule of Khan Brothers did not want to join Pakistan. In Balochistan there was similar situation. Sindh was also doubtful. The responsibility to divide the provinces of Punjab and Bengal and to draw a border line was given by the British Government to Mr. Cyril Radcliffe an Architect by profession with no knowledge of politics, sociology or religious sentiments. He was given very little time for this very difficult task. There were two separate Commissions for Punjab and Bengal both of which were under the chairmanship of Radcliffe. Those days I was very much interested in the drawing of the line of division. First it was rumoured that Lahore will be with India. It was decided to give Calcutta in Bengal to India so it was decided to give big Lahore city to Pakistan so that they could have one big city with them. At one stage we had heard that the whole of Gurdaspur District including Tehsil Shakargarh shall continue to be with India. Had it not happened the link between India and the Hindu Kingdom of Jammu and Kashmir would have broken. Unfortunately the Tehsil of Shakargarh with the five Dutt villages of Mohyals was given to Pakistan. Some Dutt families in the area did not leave their houses and continued to live there after the partition. All of them were massacred.

The area of Doaba Bari where Dutt's belonged have had the habitation of two great saints Bawa Lal Dayal who was born at Kasur near Lahore in 1355 and who died at Dhianpur in 1655 at the age of 300 years was the Guru of Mohyals. He was a great saint who had travelled throughout India, Afghanistan and other places and who had established 22 centres including one at Dhian Pur near Batala. Baba Lal Dayal Ji was 114 years elder to Guru Nanak Dev Ji. He over survived Guru Nanak Dev Ji by 94 years. Bawa Lal Ji was a great Yogi. He did rejuvenation of his body Kaya Kalap by Ayurveda method twice at the ages of 100 and 200 respectively. Guru Nanak Dev Ji (1469-1539) lived for only 70 years. His elder son, Baba Siri Chand however lived for 135 years (1494-1629). In the modern age Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya Ji (1861-1946) tried to do his own Kaya Kalap in 1938 under the guidance of an Ayurveda Yogi Shriman Tapaswi Ji (1770-1955) 185 years. Malviya Ji however failed in his effort and died in 1946 at the age of 85 only. Outside the village Bhian Duttan in the Shakargarh Tehsil there is a Beri tree (Indian jubebe plant) in a very small forest. It is said that Bawa Lal Ji used to meditate under that tree during his visits to the area. People of the area used to light lamps and candles at the site.

Other great saint associated with Shakargarh the land of Dutt clan of Mohyals was Baba Guru Nanak who was born at Talwandi now called Nanakana Sahib 90 Kms from Lahore. Baba Nanak and his sister Bibi Nanki both were born in the house of their maternal grandparents (Nanke). They were therefore named Nanki and Nanak. Nanki was married in a village named Sultanpur Lodhi near Kapurthala. Baba Nanak Devji had lived there for few year

and it is there that he received realisation after disappearing at a local stream for three days. It is from Sultanpur Lodhi that he went on his first Udasi. He was wearing saffron Chola, a topi called Selli like Muslim peers, praying beads in his hands and wooden sleepers on his feet. Baba Nanak Dev Ji was married at Batala to the daughter of Lala Mool Raj to Mata Sulakhni. A wall at the place of marriage is still there and it is called Gurdwari Kand Sahib. Lala Mool Raj was a Patwari (Land Revenue clerk) at a place called Pakhuke Randhawa now famous as Dera Baba Nanak on the left bank of river Ravi in Tehsil Shakargarh. Baba Nanak had gone on 3-4 Udasis (preaching expeditions) he used to leave his wife and two sons Baba Siri Chand and Baba Lakhmi Chand at the house of his father in law at Pakhuke Randhawa. After his final return from his last Udasi Baba Nanak decided not to undertake any further travels and settled down on the right Bank of river Ravi near Veerum Duttan giving the name Kartarpur (abode of God) to the place. Some land in the area was given to Baba Nanak Ji by his friend Ajit Randhawa from Pakhuke Randhawa village. Baba Ji got the implements and himself started farming which he did for 18 years before his death at Kartarpur itself.

There are over 40 Janam Sakhis (biographies) of Baba Nanak Ji written by different people at different times (Like Hadith in the case of prophet Mohammad). Some of the Janam Sakhis are factual and some imaginative. River Ravi has changed its course many times. It is said that after the cremation of the body of Baba Nanak his elder son had put his remains in a pot and buried it on the right Bank of the river. After flooding he searched and found the pot containing the ashes, took it to the other side of the river and buried it there at a place called Thara Sahib. Baba Nanak was a Bedi Khatri. His son Baba Siri Chand was a Sanyasi and did not marry. The younger son Baba Lakhmi Chand had a son Baba Dharam Chand who had two sons Meher Chand and Manak Chand. At the place the descendents of baba Nanak Ji established the town of Dera Baba Nanak. In the town of Dera Baba Nanak many of the Bedi residents claim themselves to be the direct descendents of Baba Nanak Dev Ji. In Dera Baba Nanak there is a Mohalla Meher Chandian and another Mohalla Manek Chandian the two branches of the Bedi family of Guru Nanak Dev Ji. There are three main Gurdwaras in Dera Baba Nanak. One is the main Darbar Sahib in the memory of Baba Nanak himself. Other is Chola Sahib where a Roomala given by Bibi Nanki, elder sister of baba Nanak on the occasion of his marriage is kept. Also kept there is the Chola worn by Baba Nanak on his visit to Mecca. It has Ayats from Quran written on it. Third is Gurdwara Tahli Sahib in the memory of Baba Siri Chand elder son of Baba Nanak Ji. Dera Baba is around 1 Km from the river Ravi. Gurdwara Darbar Sahib near Veerum Duttan is around 5 Kms from right Bank of the river. MOHYAL ASHRAMS HARIDWAR AND VRINDAVAN

1. Rooms can be booked by Yatris, 30 days in advance, which can be done, on telephone and also at the counter, in the respective Ashrams.
2. Rooms can be booked on twin sharing basis (2 adults and a child below 12 yrs) for a maximum of 3 days. Check in / Check out time is 12 noon.
3. Room bookings will be confirmed, only after payment of 50% of room donation. The amount will be forfeited if booking is not cancelled at least 48 hrs before booking date. The donation can be kept in suspense for two months for future booking, if cancellation is done 48 hrs in advance.
4. Bulk booking (more than 3 rooms) can be done only after prior written approval of GMS.
5. Room donors can donate 25% of the standard room rates (non mohyal rates) or pay the prevalent room donation as per their discretion.
6. Donations can be made only in Indian currency. Booking of rooms for foreign nationals (does not include NRI), can only be done after written approval of GMS.
7. Consumption of tobacco, liquor and non-vegetarian food in the premises of the Ashrams is strictly prohibited. Persons in inebriated condition will be denied entry to the Ashrams.
8. Yatri's coming for Asthivisajaran will be given one room on complementary basis, and complementary langar for all members who return back same day after Asthivisajaran.
9. There is no room service – meals have to be taken in the Dinning Hall of the Ashram.
10. Pets (Animals) are NOT allowed in the premises of the Ashram.

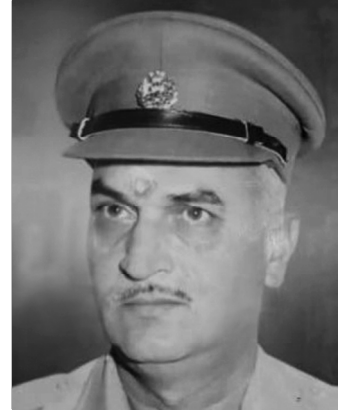

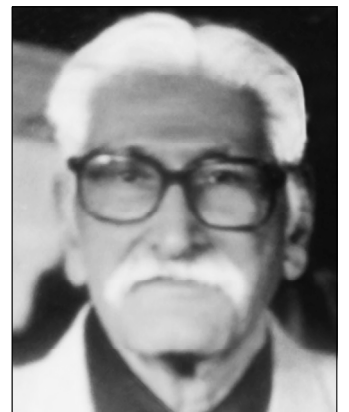

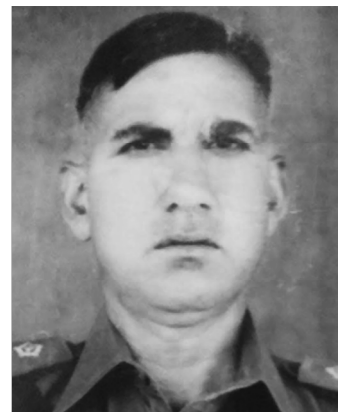

मेरी मौसी श्रीमती चनन देवी व उनके देवर मेहता हंसराज नम्बरदार भी वहीं रहते थे। देश विभाजन के बाद उन्हें कुरुक्षेत्र के पास जमीन मिली थी। वे लगभग 100 वर्ष आयु के बाद स्वर्गवास हुए।

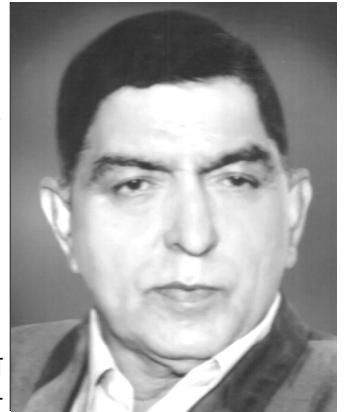
